In the spirit of Service, Not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and to honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor youth, promote patriotism and support our communities.

The American Legion Auxiliary was founded in November of 1919. The Auxiliary administers hundreds of volunteer programs, gives tens of thousands of hours to its communities and to veterans, and raises millions to support its own programs as well as other worthwhile charities familiar to Americans. While originally organized to assist the American Legion the ALA has achieved its own unique identity while working side by side with the veterans who belong to the American Legion. Like the Legion the Auxiliary's interests have broadened to encompass the entire community.

The American Legion Auxiliary is composed of male and female spouses, grandmothers, mothers, sisters, daughters, and direct and adopted female descendants of members of the American Legion. Coming out of WWII the ALA membership was near a million members, now we are at about 515,000. Last year 3.2 million hours were volunteered in servicing veterans and military. There was nearly \$7 million raised and spent on youth, scholarships, and community projects and over \$1 million in scholarships were awarded.

The programs the ALA supports are

many. American Legion Auxiliary Girls State, welcoming troops home, and Americanism Essay Contests, just to mention a few. We offer scholarships at both the National and Department (state) level.

Poppy: after WW1 the poppy flourished in Europe. Scientists attributed the growth to soils in France and Belgium becoming enriched with lime from the ruble left from the war. From the dirt and mud grew a beautiful red poppy. The red poppy came to symbolize the blood shed during battle following the publication of the war time poem "in Flanders Fields". The poem was written by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae MD while serving at the front line. On September 27, 1920, the poppy became the official flower of the American Legion family to memorialize the soldiers who fought and died during the war. In 1924 the distribution of poppies became a national program. Veterans Affairs Voluntary Services, one our pillars and original programs, supports our veterans in many ways. Christmas Gift Shops in medical centers and veterans' homes, offer veterans in these facilities an opportunity to send gifts to their loved ones at no cost. A cherished tradition since 1928 American Legion Auxiliary volunteers collect donations or purchase items as gifts for veterans. While Christmas Gift Shops may look different at each location, the experience for veterans is very similar. ALA volunteers make sure that veterans confined to their rooms can participate and offer to shop for them. Those who may not see their loved ones over the holidays can ship their gifts at no cost to them.

Burial In A National Cemetery

I want my remains to be placed at Camp Butler, so what do I need to get that done?

Do you have a copy of your discharge (most often referred to as a DD 214)? If you do, step one is already done for you. This is also the most challenging part in coordinating your final affairs, as many benefits are contingent on your discharge. It behooves you to ensure there are multiple copies set aside, preventing the last copy from accidentally being distributed during the planning process.

VA Form 40-10007 is the Application for Pre-Need determination of eligibility for burial in a VA National Cemetery. This form does not guarantee placement in the VA National Cemetery of your choosing; rather it verifies that you are in fact eligible to be placed at a VA National Cemetery. Once the form is completed, it is verified by offices in St. Louis, MO and can take a few months before receiving correspondence in return. This form is not necessary to be interred at a National Cemetery.

At the time of your passing, the designated person you have coordinating your final affairs will need a copy of your discharge if you have not filed the ap-

Plication for Pre-Need Determination. This person, whether a family member or funeral home representative will utilize your discharge when contacting the National Cemetery Scheduling Office. During that phone call, an Administration team member will work with your designated person in coordinating our availability to accommodate your needs as well as the needs of your family.

Once a time and date are established during that phone call to the National Cemetery Scheduling Office, the rest of the coordination for military honors (if applicable) and a final committal service can proceed. Establishing a schedule with the Cemetery Administration does not ensure that a minister or an honor team will be present. It is the responsibility of the designated family member or funeral home assistant to arrange for those services to occur at a National Cemetery.
